How it Works

STEP 1

STEP 2

CREATE AN ACCOUNT and submit your essay application online.

STEP 3

SUBMIT by February 2, 2027 (11:59 p.m. Hawaii Standard Time).

STEP 4

ADVANCE through live competitions—regional, state, then the National Championship.

Before you begin:

- The online application has **four text boxes**, one for each question below.
- Type your responses directly into the boxes—do not upload a file.
- Aim for **150–200 words in each box**. This is the best length to fully explain your ideas.

QUESTION 1

IMAGINE one change—big or small—that would make life better for people in your school or community in the future. Share your idea and how it could make a positive impact on your community.

Strong responses are typically between 150 and 200 words.



QUESTION 2

DESCRIBE how you would bring your idea to life. Explain how you would build trust, understand different viewpoints, and collaborate with people who care about the idea.

Strong responses are typically between 150 and 200 words.

QUESTION 3

FIND support to help you bring your idea to life. Who could help you, and how would they contribute?

Strong responses are typically between 150 and 200 words.

QUESTION 4

CONNECT your idea to the values that shaped our country. How does your idea reflect the [Founding Principles and Civic Virtues](#)?
